CERTIFICATE OVERVIEW

The Military Land Sustainability Certificate (MLSU) is an online program that provides students with an understanding of factors that influence natural resource conservation and management of military lands. The program requires the completion of a minimum of 13 graduate credit hours and is comprised of coursework in three integrated, multidisciplinary thematic areas of emphasis: land management on installations, policy analysis and development, and regional planning. The MLSU can complement existing professional graduate degrees offered in the Department of Rangeland, Wildlife and Fisheries Management (RWF) or serve as a stand-alone certificate for non-degree seeking students.

Purpose

The Department of Defense oversees more than 30 million acres of land across the U.S., prioritizing the creation of realistic training and testing environments while addressing ecological needs, particularly those of threatened and endangered species. Balancing these objectives is a complex task that demands a specialized combination of skills and expertise. The MLSU program equips students with the academic foundation and practical experience essential for success in this career field.
