Fish and Wildlife Laws and Administration

This 3-hour, in-person course provides a comprehensive examination of state and federal laws, international treaties, and conventions that govern fish and wildlife conservation. As a writing-intensive course, students also will develop and use innovative approaches to writing to include the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) tools. Key topics covered include:

- Historical and legal foundations of fish and wildlife law.
- Key state and federal legislation affecting fish and wildlife management.
- International treaties/conventions and their impact on conservation.
- Roles of state, federal, and international agencies in managing fish and wildlife resources.
- Legal case studies and administrative decisions related to fish and wildlife law.
- Responsible use of AI to aid in writing.
